#### JESUS CLEANSES A LEPER

Luke 5:12–16

- <sup>12</sup> And it happened when He was in a certain city, that behold, a man who was full of leprosy saw Jesus; and he fell on *his* face and implored Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."
- <sup>13</sup> Then He put out *His* hand and touched him, saying, "I am willing; be cleansed." Immediately the leprosy left him. <sup>14</sup> And He charged him to tell no one, "But go and show yourself to the priest, and make an offering for your cleansing, as a testimony to them, just as Moses commanded."
- <sup>15</sup> However, the report went around concerning Him all the more; and great multitudes came together to hear, and to be healed by Him of their infirmities. <sup>16</sup> So He Himself *often* withdrew into the wilderness and prayed.

#### MAIN POINT

When you respond to Jesus with humble and confident faith, you will find deliverance from your sin and shame.

## I. Helpless Sinners

#### A. Problem

- 1. Two types of leprosy
  - a) Tuberculoid (less severe)
  - b) Lepromatous (more sever)
- 2. To be a leper was to be an outcast (cf. Lev. 13:1ff)

### B. Extent

- 1. Luke's medical diagnosis: *full of leprosy*
- 2. Without a miracle, the man was doomed to a painful death
