Luke 15:11–32

Main Point

Rejoice at God's gracious forgiveness toward repentant sinners.

I. God graciously receives repentant sinners. (15:11–24)

A. Sinners take advantage of the gracious blessings of God.

1. The youngest son demands his inheritance and the father graciously gave it to him.
2. The youngest son took the blessing of the inheritance and squandered it with riotous living.

B. Sinners who repent will be received by the Father.

1. The son, who decided to return to his father, humbled himself and prepared to be welcomed not as a son but as a slave.
2. The father, who looked for the return of his lost son, welcomed him back not just as a son but as a celebrated and honored son.
